program was well received. Thank you Michael Klein, Jon Jacobson, Jenny Bencardino, Robert Campbell, and Ted Miller, and your committees, for doing a masterful job on the courses and posters. It was encouraging to see some of our male members in kilts at the gala dinner at the Signet Library (see photo). The Hopetoun House Members dinner was memorable—haggis, tiger heads, bagpipes and all. We were lucky to have beautiful weather at the Edinburgh Castle reception and that made it the perfect spot for mingling and viewing Edinburgh at night in a truly majestic spot.

Next up is our meeting in Wailea, Maui. This is our first time to Hawaii and I am very excited to share this special place with the membership. For those of you who know Hawaii, I am sure that you are excited about this novel experience for the ISS. And to those who have never travelled there, you are in for a treat that is not to be missed. This is a once in a lifetime chance to experience a place that is beautiful and tranquil, and has a lot to offer for every attendee and their families. The weather should be nice at that time of year.

The meeting will be held from Monday, September 28 to Friday, October 2, 2015. Note the new Monday to Friday inclusive days of our meeting. This continues with the theme of shortening the meeting and gives members the

weekends for travel to and from the meeting. We will have our Members meeting on Monday and Tuesday with a Members lunch on Monday. The Special Scientific Session is scheduled for Monday afternoon, along with the all day Tuesday Ultrasound Course. The review course will run from Wednesday to Friday, with Don Resnick's Quiz Panel on Thursday afternoon. Social events include the pre-meeting reception on Sunday evening, the Members Dinner on Tuesday evening, an outdoor reception for the Review Course on Wednesday evening and the Gala dinner on Friday. Several of our social events will be held outside on property (weather permitting) with a view of the ocean.

There are nonstop flights to Maui from many parts of Asia, Australia, South America, Central America, and North America. To Europeans and those from the Middle East and India, it might seem far away, but the trip may only involve a change of planes on the East or West Coast of the US or Canada and the airfare is quite reasonable. United, Alaska, Hawaiian, Delta and American Airlines as well as many of the Asian airlines fly into Maui or Honolulu. You can also combine your Maui trip with a visit to another island, as there are quick flight connections between the islands. We do encourage you to rent a car while on the island, as there is little public transportation for tourists and taxis and shuttles can be expensive.

We will be meeting at the Grand Wailea Resort Hotel and Spa. This is a worldrenowned Waldorf Astoria property that is part of the Hilton Hotel group. The room rates are very reasonable, starting at \$199. We encourage you to book early to lock in the best rates. There are some incentives for those who stay at the hotel. If you book by July 15, 2015, you will receive a \$100 hotel credit and be entered to win a poolside cabana for a day. Staying at the meeting property will ensure reduced parking fees and waived resort fees, which is definitely worth considering. Parking can run up to \$30 a day for those who are staying off property and this resort is not within walking distance of most Maui hotels, airbnbs, or condos. We really encourage our members to stay on property given all of these factors and you will not regret it!! The grounds are large and engaging with a gorgeous beach that stretches along the Wailea coastline offering all types of activities such as swimming, surfing and paddleboarding. If you stay at the Grand Wailea, you can choose from nine different world- renowned pools ranging from a beautiful adult pool to a lazy river. You can obtain scuba certification right on property. There are five golf courses around the hotel. We can start a list of interested members so that you can organize outings and tee off together. Tennis is also available. There are several excellent restaurants at the Grand Wailea and you can drive to other great eateries within 5-10 minutes of the hotel. Shopping is excellent in Wailea and Kaanapali. There are also spectacular sites within one to a few hours drive. These include Haleakala volcano down which you can bike at sunrise, the lavender fields and botanical gardens in the hills above the hotel, the Road to Hana (bring dramamine), exciting Kaanapali, windsurfing on the east shore, and beautiful Kapalua at the top of the Island. The casual nature of the meeting will be refreshing and our male members should appreciate not having to wear a tie or a kilt!!!

Dear Members.

The Societe D'Imagerie Musculo-Squeletique (SIMS) is the national Musculoskeletal Imaging Society in France. With the ISS annual meeting planned for Paris, France in 2016, members of SIMS have asked their President-Elect, ISS member Anne Cotten, to inquire about a finite number of their members attending the 2016 ISS Members Meeting. The executive committee is cognizant of the fact that the ISS members meeting has traditionally only been open to attendance by full ISS members and other presenters in that meeting. The opportunity of opening the 2016 ISS members meeting in Paris to SIMS members' attendance would be a hospitable gesture and would provide for greater profile of the ISS annual meeting locally within France, serving as a practical means of facilitating inter-society relations and encouraging ISS membership of SIMS members in the future. This initiative with SIMS would only apply for 2016 in conjunction with the annual ISS meeting in Paris. A similar initiative could be explored with Pathology societies in France. If successful, similar arrangements could be considered with other local MSK societies and the annual meeting in the future.

## REFRESHER COURSE PROGRAM COMMITTEE

The committee was pleased to note very positive feedback for the 2014 course in Edinburgh, with 354 of 377 respondents feeling the course had successfully met its expectations and personal learning needs. Planning for the 2015 refresher course in Hawaii started prior to the Edinburgh meeting, and we hope that it will result in another successful program. We have once again made use of the popular rapid-fire (10-minute lecture)

sessions, the film quiz session, the "Hot Topics" session on injectables, and the "How I Do It" session on advanced imaging topics, based on favorable feedback from attendees. In addition, we have added a new session called "Cases I Found Challenging," based on attendee feedback of wanting case-based learning, and are offering for the first time two SAMs credits for the Trauma and Marrow sessions. We also want to express appreciation for the collaboration of the pathology members of the society who will be participating in the Hawaii Refresher Course.

### REFRESHER COURSE PROMOTION COMMITTEE

The Refresher Course Promotion Committee recruited new members last October– November. Since then, the team has been working hard on the promotion: the first and second notices were already sent by emails and mail. This is distributed to all the journal's subscribers (around 3,000).

We will continue with the same type of activities intensively until the summer.

I would like to thank the devoted committee members that are truly investing efforts and time in the promotion, and Pam Murphy and Janel Angeles from WJ Weiser & Associates for their hard work.

The Special Scientific Session (SSS) will take place during the Members' Meeting of the Annual Meeting of the ISS on Monday afternoon, September 28, while the Breakout Scientific Session will take place during Tuesday's lunch, September

29, 2015. The abstracts submitted for potential inclusion in the session will be made available for blinded review by the Scientific Session Committee panel during the months of February and March, 2015, using Skeletal Radiology's Editorial Manager. All abstracts will be evaluated by at least two members of the Special Scientific Session Committee and graded on a scale from 1 to 10 (worst - best). Both acceptance and rejection notifications will be sent electronically before April 10, 2015. Two plaques will be presented during the SSS: the Skeletal Radiology Editors Award and the ISS Special Scientific Session Excellence Award, which will be announced at the end of the program. Therefore, all presenters are encouraged to stay for the entire length of the session.
